Pathfinder students must take **3 core courses and 2 additional Pathfinder electives** to gain advanced standing for RSG courses as follows:

Pathfinder Core Courses:

- 1. Pathfinder Basic Course
- 2. The Religious and Political Ideas of the Israeli-Palestinian Conflict
- 3. Jews and Christians in the Bible, History, and Today

Advanced Standing pathway for GOV653 Middle East Politics (Regent Course):

- 1. Introduction to the History and Culture of Lebanon (Pathfinder elective)
- 2. Syria: History and Contemporary Challenges (Pathfinder elective)

Advanced standing pathway for GOV652 U.S. Foreign Policy in the Middle East (Regent Course):

- 1. Near East Security Dynamics (Pathfinder elective)
- 2. U.S. Foreign Policy in the Near East (Pathfinder elective)

Advanced standing pathway for GOV 672 Islamic Political Thought (Regent Course):

- 1. Introduction to Islam (Pathfinder elective)
- 2. Christian Communities in the Near East (Pathfinder elective)

***Students can obtain advanced standing in a maximum of 2 out of these 3 possible courses.
